

# Knit a Fringed Stole

28 x 72 inches

**Material:** Kentucky All Purpose Yarn, 7 skeins, white or color; 1 pair knitting needles, size 8; 1 crochet hook, size 1.

**Directions:** Cast on 80 sts. Rows 1 - 2 knit. Row 3—knit but wrap yarn twice around needle before completing k st as usual. Row 4—knit, inserting needle in first loop and dropping off other loop when completing st to form a long loop st. Repeat rows 1 to 4 for pat st until stole measures about 66 inches. Bind off on next row 2 of pattern st; do not break off but, using crochet hook, work 1 sc in each ridge and 1 sc in each long st along edge. Break off. Join yarn on other edge and work it in sc to correspond.

**Fringe:** Wrap yarn 3 times around 4 fingers (or cardboard) to form  $3\frac{1}{2}$  inch skein. Cut yarn and remove skein. Holding end of skein with loose cut ends downward, insert crochet hook upward between first and second sts of second row and pull top loop of skein thru stole. Remove hook, open top end of skein to form loop and insert bottom end of skein thru loop, pulling it down so top loop is against stole. Skip 2 sts and repeat process. Cut skeins to make even edge. Make a like fringe on other end of stole.

**Note:** If you are tall and wish to make this stole a little longer, simply add extra pattern sts at approximately 1 pat st per inch.

**Abbreviations:** st = stitch; k = knit; sc = single crochet; pat = pattern.



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
