

Leopard Pattern Hat and Gloves



THE GLOVES

MATERIALS:

4 PLY BEEHIVE FINGERING PATONISED. 1 oz. Gold No. 798 (A). 2 ozs. Brown No. 2017 (B). Two No. 12 and two No. 10 Queen Bee Knitting Needles. One Medium Crochet Hook.

SIZE: 6 $\frac{3}{4}$ —7 $\frac{1}{4}$. For size 6—6 $\frac{1}{2}$ use No. 13 needles in place of No. 12 needles and No. 11 needles in place of No. 10 needles and work from same instructions.

Tension: 7 $\frac{1}{2}$ sts. and 10 rows = 1 inch with No. 10 needles.

Check tension—see page 40.

For Washing Instructions—see page 41.

NOTE—When working in Fair Isle, be sure to weave the wools on the wrong side of the work, see page 40. DO NOT PULL LOOPS ACROSS.

LEFT GLOVE—BACK: With (B) wool and No. 12 needles cast on 43 sts.

1st row: Knit.

2nd row: K1. Purl to last st. K1. Repeat 1st. and 2nd rows once.

5th row: Cast off 12 sts. loosely. Knit to end of row. Join (A) wool. Change to No. 10 needles and beginning with knit row, proceed:—

Working in Fair Isle, see page 40, being careful to read knit rows from right to left and purl rows from left to right, work to end of 42nd row of Chart, see above.

Next row: Work 1st. 9 sts. in pattern from Chart. Turn. Working on these 9 sts. as given for thumb, continue in pattern to end of Chart. With (A) wool, cast off tightly, knitting 2 sts. tog. across row.

Join wools to remaining 31 sts. and work in pattern as given in Chart for these 31 sts. to end of 54th row.

Make each finger as given in Chart and cast off with (A) wool as given for thumb.

RIGHT GLOVE—BACK: With (B) wool and No. 12 needles cast on 43 sts.

1st row: Knit.

2nd row: K1. Purl to last st. K1. Repeat 1st. and 2nd rows once, 1st. row once.

6th row: Cast off 12 sts. loosely. Slip the st. on right hand needle onto a No. 10 needle. This st. counts as the 1st. (B) st. in 1st. row of Chart. Working with No. 10 needles for remainder of work and beginning with knit row, join (A) wool and work in Fair Isle from Chart, reversing Chart by reading knit rows from left to right and purl rows from right to left. It will be necessary to work 1 more row from Chart before making thumb and fingers.

TO MAKE UP: Darn in all ends. Sew the 12 cast-off sts. along side edge of each piece and turn over and hem the border in position as illustrated. With right side of work facing and (B) wool, work 1 row s.c. along remaining edge and fingers of each palm and back. With (B) wool sew each palm to each back.

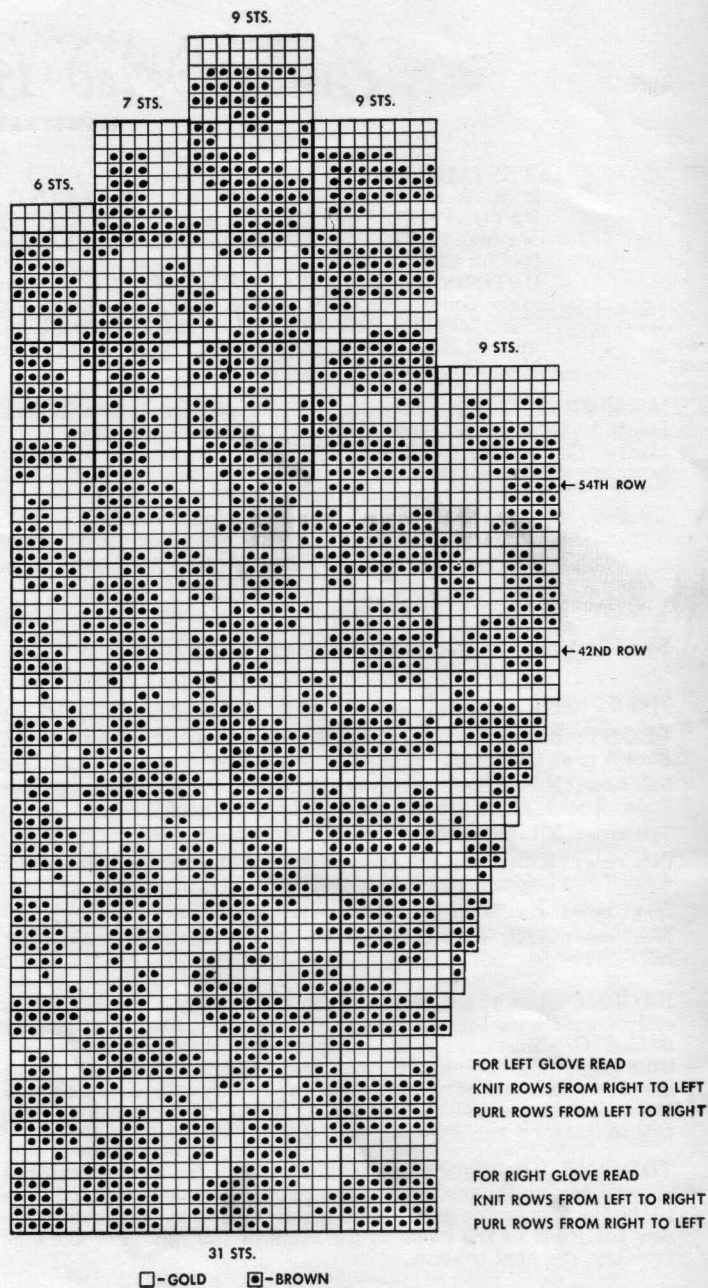
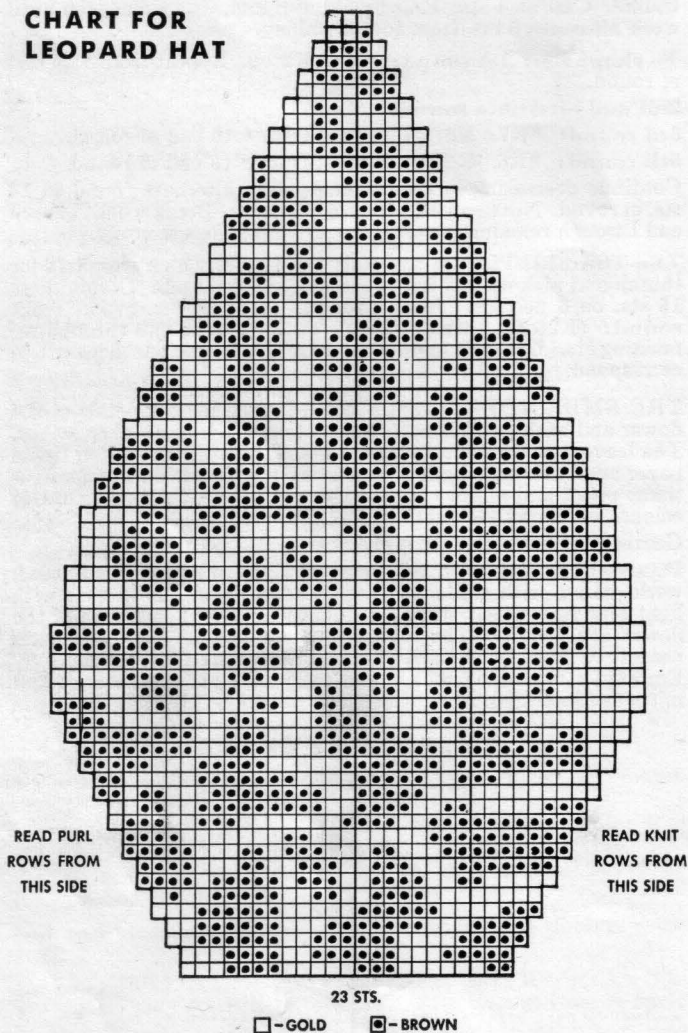


CHART FOR LEOPARD HAT



THE HAT

MATERIALS:

4 PLY BEEHIVE FINGERING PATONISED. 2 ozs. each Gold No. 798 (A) and Brown No. 2017 (B). Two No. 10 Queen Bee Knitting Needles. Set of 4 No. 12 Queen Bee Knitting Needles (points at both ends). $\frac{3}{8}$ yd. thick Piping Cord. $\frac{1}{3}$ yd. Brown Taffeta for Lining. Spool of Brown Sewing Thread.

MEASUREMENTS: Diameter of crown from point to point $11\frac{1}{2}$ ins.

Tension: $7\frac{1}{2}$ sts. and 10 rows = 1 inch with No. 10 needles.

Check tension—see page 40.

For Washing Instructions—see page 41.

NOTE—When working in Fair Isle, be sure to weave the wools on the wrong side of the work, see page 40.

DO NOT PULL LOOPS ACROSS.

With (A) wool and No. 10 needles cast on 23 sts. Join (B). Working in Fair Isle, see page 40, being careful to read knit rows from right to left and purl rows from left to right, work to end of Chart, see right. Work 6 more pieces to correspond.

TO MAKE UP: Darn in all ends. Block each piece $8\frac{1}{4}$ ins. long and $4\frac{3}{4}$ ins. wide at widest part. Before sewing cut a paper pattern for lining from one of the blocked pieces allowing $\frac{3}{8}$ inch extra all around for seams. Sew the knitted pieces together with (B) wool.

To make headband roll: With right side of work facing, (B) wool and No. 12 needles pick up and knit 23 sts. along cast-on edge of each piece, dividing sts. on needles as follows:—1st needle: 54 sts. 2nd needle: 54 sts. 3rd needle: 53 sts. (161 sts. in round). Join in round and knit even for 2 ins. Cast off very loosely. Cut the piping cord slightly larger than desired headsize and join ends together. Cut a bias strip of taffeta $1\frac{1}{2}$ ins. wide and cover piping cord. Place piping cord inside the roll and sew in position as illustrated.

Cut 7 pieces of taffeta for lining from paper pattern and sew together. Turn under lower edge and hem in position along the inside edge of the roll. Tack the centre of hat to the centre of lining at top.
